As most of you know I came back from the Hawaiian Mission Trip with a souvenir I didn't really care for—a fully torn ligament at in my right elbow. I was turning a bunk bed frame for the ladies to paint when it happened. When I saw the doctor here he said that I needed immediate surgery to reattach the ligament. On May 5 Dr. Prince inserted two anchors into the large bone in my forearm and attached the ligament to the anchors. I was in an enclosed splint totally immobilizing the elbow for two weeks and now am in a metal brace with limited movement of my elbow. I will be in this brace for a total of four weeks. Needless to say that it has affected what I am able to do as well as my stamina. Thank you for your concern and your prayers. Please pray for a complete and quick recovery.

The Hawaii Mission Trip was a great success despite my accident. We were able to accomplish more than my brother-in-law thought we would get done. The team completely painted the inside of three dorm type buildings. Each building sleeps at least 24 people. The bunk beds were also taken apart, painted and put back together. Also shoe molding was installed, screens put back up, curtains put back up, floors stripped of wax, the floors waxed, all beds and furniture put back in place, all doors painted some with new hard ware installed, a well as several other odd jobs. Whew!!!! The members of the team had a mind to work and they did. We also had time to see a lot of the island. My sister said that they have received rave reviews about the change in the look of those three buildings from those who have stayed in them before and after the team's work.

There is a wonderful opportunity for a couple or single to go help at this conference center for a month to six weeks. It is hard work, but in a rewarding. You would need to arrange and pay for your own flight. The only other expense you would have is for some of your food. The conference center would provide your lodging at no cost to you. It is a great way to serve the Lord as well as get to see a beautiful part of the world.

The Executive Committee meeting on May 23 had 35 present including 13 pastors representing 21 churches. There was an excellent spirit among all present. We heard reports from almost all of our active teams, committees, and ministries. We also approved recommendations from the Budget/Finance Team to take money (\$5,000) out of the Building Fund to complete the shower trailer for New York and to set up a Contingency Fund for expenditures that might come up that have not been budgeted. This money for this fund will come from the contribution we receive from the GBC for their office space in our building. The Contingency Fund will be administered by the Budget/Finance Team. A "Policy and Procedures for the Prevention of Child Abuse" was adopted. Copies are available upon request. This will make possible for any church (even without a policy, God forbid) to participate in activities of the association and GBC that involve children, youth, or the disabled. It is important that every church have a policy like this in place for protecting your children as well as satisfying your insurance company. It is sad that we have to have these kinds of policies, but that is the situation we face.

Don't forget, though, that God is still on His throne!
