At the evening session the attendance was between 500-600. Our business session went very quickly resulting in a longer time to fellowship. What a great benefit! The love offering for Henry Blackaby was \$1,550. Henry brought two powerful messages on prayer.

At the pastor's/staff luncheon we had approximately 80 attend with Richard Blackaby doing most of the sharing. It was a blessed time. At the Spiritual Leadership Conference we had approximately 600-700 in attendance on Friday night and a little over half of that number on Saturday. The love offering for Henry and Richard Blackaby was \$4,265.50 Praise the Lord for the generosity of God's people. God met us in powerful ways through the ministry of Henry and Richard Blackaby.
